Welcome to Deba, your new home, your new town. Together, we look forward to growing and progressing together.



HISTORY AND CHARACTERISTICS



Deba's rich history traces back thousands of years, with a deep connection to the sea and water that has remained strong throughout the ages. Evidence of human settlement in the area dates back to the Upper Palaeolithic era, and even the Roman chronicles mention the 'Deva' river, which would later lend its name to the town.

The official establishment of Deba as a town occurred in 1343, following the granting of a town charter by King Alfonso IV to the inhabitants of Monte Real de Iciar years earlier in 1294. Recognising the benefits of relocating closer to the coast, the residents founded the town on the water's edge, naming it Monreal de Deva.

Situated on the right bank of the Deba river, the town's economy thrived on fishing, agriculture, industry, and trade. Like other fisherman along the coast, whaling was a significant focus for the locals alongside other forms of fishing. Industrial activities centred around forges, strategically positioned along rivers and streams to harness waterpower for iron tool production.

Deba experienced a period of prosperity driven by maritime trade in the 15th century. The port served as a crucial hub for exporting Castilian and Aragonese wool to various European destinations. However, with the opening of the Orduña pass and advancements in the steel industry, coupled with the limitations posed by shallow waters, Deba's strategic importance gradually waned.

By the mid-19th century, as maritime traffic dwindled, Deba embraced tourism as a new economic avenue, particularly during the summer months. The town's scenic beach attracted visitors seeking relaxation and sea bathing, maintaining its appeal despite changing trends in the 1960s and 70s.

Today, Deba continues to embrace its coastal identity, offering stunning beaches, cliffs, and Cretaceous limestone formations that provide a glimpse into millions of years of geological history. Visitors can explore the UNESCO World Geopark on the Basque Coast and delve into the region's prehistoric heritage in the nearby valleys.

Opening hours: from 8 am to 3 pm, Monday to Friday (by appointment) Everyone who resides in Deba should register in the municipal register, which is called empadronamiento (census registration). Regardless of legal status, all individuals residing in Deba must register at the Town Hall, ensuring access to various rights and services as a resident of the town:

- PUBLIC HEALTH CARE
- BASIC SCHOOLING FOR CHILDREN
- SOCIAL SERVICE RESOURCES
- ETC.

Census registration is a personal responsibility, meaning individuals must register themselves, and no one else can do it on their behalf. Consent from the property owner is required for registration.

Non-EU foreigners, excluding those with long-term residence permits, must renew their registration in the Municipal Register within two years of initial registration. Failure to do so may result in deregistration by the municipality.

The Deba Town Hall has a Social Services department whose primary objective is to identify and address the social needs of individuals and families registered and living in Deba.

This department aims to:

- Promote personal autonomy and address the needs of individuals and families arising from dependency.
- Address needs resulting from situations of lack of protection.
- Address situations of exclusion and promote the social integration of individuals, families, and groups.
- Respond to needs arising from emergency situations.



LEGALISATION

Administrative legalisation involves obtaining the necessary permits and visas to reside legally in Deba. To check your legalisation process and determine the appropriate steps, you can contact the Town Hall's Social Service office.


